## **DIVISIONAL HAPPENINGS**

#### FAFSA for Academic Year 2026-2027 is Available Now

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid for the 2026–2027 academic year is now open and available to complete. Students can complete their application online at studentaid.gov. The Institutional Aid Application for Undocumented Students is also available online for students to complete, Undocumented Students - All Students Welcome at UConn | Office of Student Financial Aid Services. The on-time priority deadline is February 15, 2026. Please encourage students to apply early to maximize their financial aid opportunities!

### **Spring 2026 Registration and Key Deadlines**

Although class registration appointments concluded on November 5, students can still adjust their schedules. **Today, November 10, is the last day to drop a class with a "W" or change a course to Pass/No Pass.** All students will receive reminders in October and November that they must be registered for classes by December 5 to maintain their Spring 2026 housing assignment; those who are not registered by that date will have their housing assignment canceled.

To support students in registering for spring classes, the Dean of Students Office, One Stop, Campus Housing, Bursar, Undergraduate Advising, and SHaW are partnering to host a Solutions Lab, an in-person opportunity for students to receive help resolving holds and identifying next steps.

## **Campus Housing Highlights**

The **Spring 2026 housing application** is now available for new spring residents and admits, students returning from off-campus programs (EGL), Spring into Storrs students, and approved campus change students. Any other student interested in living on campus for the spring semester is also welcome to apply. The deadline to submit the application and being considered on time is **November 14**.

**Campus change** students must submit their housing application **and** have their campus change approved by **November 14** to be eligible for housing at Storrs. *Spring into Storrs* students are required to live on campus for the spring semester as part of their commitment to UConn and will receive reminders to submit their application.

The Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Team provides resources and professional development opportunities that strengthen the department's work with staff and students. This semester, the team led sessions on bias awareness, conduct meetings, and social justice programming, and hosted a Unity Day event featuring Dr. Candace Reese, who spoke about Juneteenth and cultural growth. The DEI Team will continue offering programs that celebrate and support UConn's diverse community.

## Test your Limits at the 2025 New England DEKA FIT Roadshow!

On Saturday, November 22, UConn Recreation will proudly host the New England DEKA FIT Roadshow at the Student Recreation Center. This high-energy stop on the national DEKA tour is presented by DEKA and UConn Rec, transforming training into *fitness gamified* for all levels.

DEKA FIT features 10 functional fitness zones, each preceded by a 500-meter run (totaling 5K). Participants can test their fitness, earn their DEKA Mark, and compete for a spot on the Global Leaderboard—with the chance to qualify for the 2026 DEKA World Championships.

#### **Event Heats:**

- Age Group Heat Open to all levels; eligible for Age Group recognition.
- **Elite Heat** For competitive athletes seeking podium honors.
- Ruck Heat Complete the course with a ruck or backpack.
- Team Heat Teams of two (adult, youth, or mixed) divide and conquer the DEKA FIT arena.

Spectators are welcome — come cheer on athletes and experience the excitement! Every finisher receives a DEKA FIT tee, medal, and wedge, with podium awards for top finishers.
